— Student Free Day & EOT —

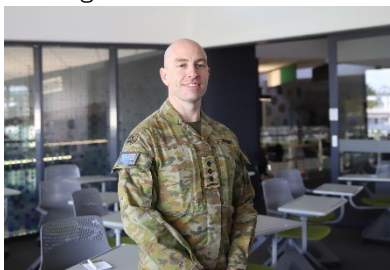
